Nestled between the edge of the New Forest and Southampton Water, the village of Hythe, with its surrounding area known as 'The Waterside', offers the perfect location to watch the majestic cruise liners.

Enjoy a leisurely stroll around Hythe village with its many unique shops, café's, pubs and restaurants, Hythe Marina with its distinctive fishing village style development, or along the raised boardwalk of the Promenade. There are plenty of waterfront places to sit and enjoy the comings and goings on Southampton Water.

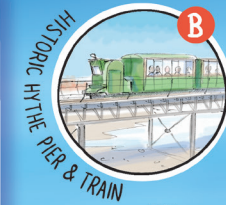
Hythe is also well known for its historic pier and boasts the world's oldest pier train. If you don't fancy the 700 yard (640m) walk down the pier, then the train regularly trundles up and down to catch the ferry sailing back and forth between Hythe and the city of Southampton, which in addition to a wealth of retail, entertainment and dining venues, has its own interesting maritime history and some of England's best preserved Medieval Town Walls (guided walks are available), as well as a Titanic Memorial, Museums and some pleasant urban parks.

Within a short distance of Hythe are the lovely villages of Dibden Purlieu, Blackfield, Fawley, Exbury and Beaulieu, all with their own unique vistas and characteristics. While the beaches at Lepe Country Park with its fascinating history of the D-Day Preparations and underground Cold War Monitoring Post, and Calshot with its historic Tudor Castle and Flying Boat Hangars situated on Calshot Spit are both well worth a visit and offer picturesque views of the Coastline, The Solent and the Isle of Wight.

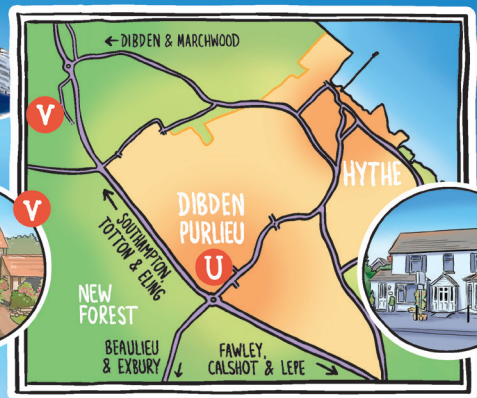

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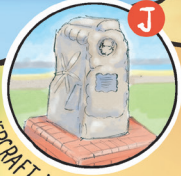

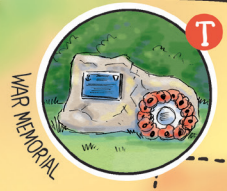

HYTHE, HAMPSHIRE

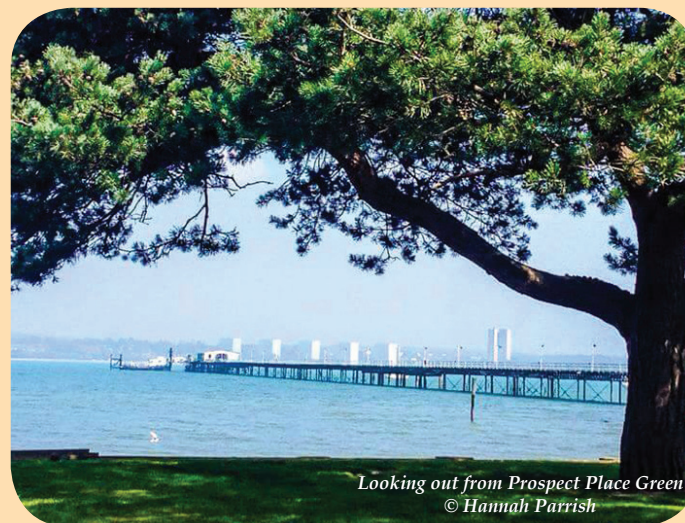
The settlement of Hythe dates back to Anglo Saxon times and has a fascinating history. Its name derives from 'Hyth' an Old English word for a permanent landing place on a river or sheltered estuary; the position of Hythe definitely fits that description. With many waterfront places to sit and enjoy watching the shipping on Southampton Water, and a pleasant and friendly village, a visit to Hythe is certain to be a delight to all.



Its most famous landmark, the historic Pier, includes Britain's oldest continuously operating pier train. The Pier itself opened on January 1st 1881, when a hand propelled truck carried luggage and goods along its 700 yards (640m) length. In 1901 a truck running on narrow gauge railway lines was introduced, then in 1922 rails were laid and electricity supply provided to run a passenger train. Information boards along the pier tell more about its history and some of its famous visitors.

Around the village along the High street, buildings and facades date back to Georgian times; although parts of The Lord Nelson pub building date back to the mid 1600's. Look upwards at the windows above

some of the shops to see the character buildings. In St. John's Street, behind The Grove which houses the Parish offices, delightful gardens offer uninterrupted views across the water, and a stone commemoration to the pioneering work of Sir Christopher Cockerell, the inventor of the hovercraft, who lived in the village until shortly before his death in 1999. The sculpture, depicting the inventor and his work, was erected close to the former site of his company, Hovercraft Development Ltd. Evidence of another famous Hythe resident can be found a little further along at the bottom of South Street, where a blue plaque fixed to a picturesque cottage, announces that T. E. Lawrence lived there from 1931-32. The gentleman was better known as 'Lawrence of Arabia'. Not far from the Pier is Ebenezers, a former chapel built in 1845, now restored and converted into a friendly, family run pub whilst retaining many of its original features. Nearby the three distinctive white cottages at the end of The Marsh; Pylewell Cottages, date between the mid-17th century and early 19th century. Opposite, the white brick building, now occupied by BeBe's Café, was



built in 1883 for tourists coming by ferry from Southampton looking for refreshments. It served as Hythe's Post Office between the wars, before returning to its original use as a café. Next door the distinctive building, previously the Anchor and Hope pub, with its arched windows, is now the home of a local community magazine and also the National Park Authority Local Information Point for Hythe and The Waterside.

The imposing former Drummond Arms, now converted into apartments, stands opposite the Pier entrance. Being close to the departure point, made it ideally located for travellers and has been used as a public house since the mid-17th century. The present building was built in 1840. Guided Walks around Hythe giving more information about its interesting history are available during the summer season, details of which can be obtained from the Hythe Ferry office.

The Waterside Heritage Centre, located at the old Hythe Train Station, just outside of the village centre is open three days a week, see the map for more details.

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Spend time browsing the pleasant range of interesting shops Hythe has to offer, take advantage of the wide choice of places to shop, eat and drink.

Enjoy the waterfront views from The Promenade, Prospect Place Green and the gardens behind The Grove in St. John's Street.

Access for wheelchairs is good in most shops and there are plenty of places to sit when you feel like a break. There is easy pedestrian access from the main car parks, as well as some short-stay on-street parking. Hythe has great transport links throughout the summer with regular buses and the ferry. The New Forest Tour Bus stops in Hythe giving access to The New Forest and beyond from 6th July to 8th September.

Every Tuesday is market day in the village centre, with an array of stalls to cater for everyone. Hythe also welcomes the Hythe Village Bank Holiday Fayre



on Monday 27th May, Rock The Pier on Saturday 27th July and the August Bank Holiday Fayre on Monday 26th August, all incorporating Artisan Foods, gifts, arts, design, antique and vintage stalls.

The French Market returns again on Saturday 13th July and Friday 22nd November and the Italian Market on Saturday 3rd August, both offer tastes of the Continent. The High Street, the Marsh and Pylewell Road and Precinct all offer a great selection of local shops and businesses and the Promenade, with its accessible boardwalks and seating areas, is an ideal spot to watch the maritime activity on Southampton Water. Another pedestrian friendly area worth a visit is the Marina with its choice of places to eat while enjoying the scenic views.

Hythe is still very much a village with a warm and friendly atmosphere where the shops and businesses pride themselves on customer care and pay particular attention to making visitors feel welcome.

Visitor information is available at the Pier entrance, The Herald Office on the corner of the High Street and Hythe & Dibden Parish Council offices in The Grove, St. John's Street.
